terrible weed called the Russian thistle. It is said to have caused the loss of \$40,000,000 during the past year. It spreads rapidly, and from a single root forms a mass two to six feet in diameter and half as high. About seventeen years ago the weed was introduced in flaxseed brought from Russia and sowed near Scotland, South Dakota. It was noticed at the time, but carelessly neglected when extermination would have been easy. In 1891 it became noticeably troublesome, and last year its ravages had extended over thirty thousand square miles, inflicting a loss of \$20,000,000. This year, besides the Dakotas, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Iowa and Nebraska have been invaded. The most provoking thing about this and all similar invasions is that there was once a time, in every case, when the pest could have been destroyed by half an hour's work, while now the entire force of this great nation is baffled by it. In precisely the same way, there is a time in the growth of every evil habit when a little vigorous work and prayer will uproot it. If this is neglocted, the pest becomes master of our soul's plantations, even more rapidly than the Russian thistle spread over the Dakotas. Is this an old truth? Never mind. It is a truth that needs repeating as long as there are weeds and habits. - Golden Rule.




