"If a man marry in the United States, and leave his wife, and come to Canada, and marry another; does his Law sufficiently recognize the marriage Laws of the United States, as to consider him guilty of Bigamy, and liable to be tried for the same?" A. The party can be indicted for Bigamy, and convicted on proof of former marriage in fact. 2. Q. "Can the first wife, on finding him here, compel him to allow her a maintenance?" A.—He is liable for necessaries furnished to his wife. From this opinion, delivered by God authority, it appears that law and morality, in this case, exactly concur.
