Under this constitution the province can alter and improve. the school law to any degree. The single limitation is that concerning seperate schools. Nothing new is introduced. Just what has been in operation as regards separate schools from 1892 this time is preserved. to There is not one separate school in whole Lumsden district, the but I have no doubt you know that under the N. W. T. Ordinances our separate school is not a sectarian school, but is regulated and managed by the Government in every detail the same as the ordinary public school. Even as regards the religious instruction permitted from 3 30 to 4 o'clock, no distinction is made between the separate and public school-the same privilege extends to all. The education constitution given us has this decided advantage - we know exactly what it means and the kind of separate schools we are to have under it.
