The Bureau of United Nations Affairs (UNA) is charged primarily with the management of Canadian policy with respect to the activities of the United Nations system of organizations. It is a basic premise of Canadian policy to continue actively to strengthen the United Nations system as an effective instrument for international cooperation and, in particular, to improve the capacity of the United Nations Charter responsibilities. In pursuing these objectives, the UNA works closely with other departments and government departments and agencies, and maintains the liaison with the Secretary-General of the United Nations.

The UNA is responsible for the general management of Canadian policy in the United Nations system. It is also responsible for assisting the political and administrative staff of the United Nations Secretariat, the General Assembly and other United Nations organs, and coordinating Canadian policy and activities in those areas.
