

ARTICLE 6

The Government of Belgium will furnish certified copies of the Protocol to each Government Signatory of the Paris Agreement on Reparation of January 24, 1946, and to each Government on whose behalf the Protocol is signed, and will also inform those Governments of all accessions to the Protocol received thereunder.

In witness whereof the undersigned, being duly authorized by their respective Governments, have signed the present Protocol.

Done in Brussels, on February 3rd, 1949 in the English and French languages, the two texts being equally authentic, in a single original which shall be deposited in the Archives of the Government of Belgium.

SECOND ADDITIONAL SUPPLEMENTARY PROTOCOL TO THE BRUSSELS AGREEMENT OF DECEMBER 5th, 1947, RELATING TO THE RESOLUTION OF CONFLICTING CLAIMS TO GERMAN ENEMY ASSETS, AND TO THE PROTOCOL, SIGNED IN BRUSSELS, ON FEBRUARY 3rd, 1949, ADDITIONAL TO THAT AGREEMENT, SIGNED IN BRUSSELS, ON MAY 10th, 1950.

The Governments Parties to the present Protocol,

Desiring to insure the coming into force of the Agreement Relating to the Resolution of Conflicting Claims to German Enemy Assets, opened for signature, at Brussels, December 5, 1947, hereafter called the Brussels Agreement, and desiring to this effect to extend from September 1, 1948 to September 1, 1950 the time stipulated in the first paragraph of Article 5 of the aforesaid Brussels Agreement and likewise desiring to this effect to extend from September 1, 1949 to September 1, 1950 the time stipulated in the Protocol, signed in Brussels, February 3, 1949 additional to the Brussels Agreement,

Have agreed as follows:

The date September 1, 1950 shall be considered as replacing the date September 1, 1949 wherever the latter date appears in the Additional Protocol signed in Brussels, on February 3, 1949 additional to the aforesaid Brussels Agreement.

In witness whereof, the undersigned, being duly authorized by their respective Governments, have signed the present Protocol.

Done in Brussels, on May 10th 1950, in the English and French languages, the two texts being equally authentic, in a single original which shall be deposited in the Archives of the Government of Belgium.
