of operation than the present type. I can speak with some assurance on this subject, of which I have personal knowledge, and I will discuss it with the grain commissioners and give them the benefit of the experience I have had.

Mr. JELLIFF: Has the minister any returns submitted by the Board of Grain Commissioners on overages from the public terminal elevators for the crop year 1926? I do not believe that report was received until

a short time ago and it would be interesting to discover why the Board of Grain Commissioners did not collect on these overages.

Mr. MALCOLM: I have a long statement here which I will send to my hon. friend.

Mr. JELLIFF: Perhaps the minister had better put it on Hansard.

Mr. MALCOLM: I will hand it to Hansard.

The statement is as follows:
