## SALE OF SCHOOL LANDS IN WESTERN PROVINCES.

## MOTION

Hon. Mr. DAVIS moved:

That in view of the rapid increase in land values in the western provinces, this Senate is of the opinion that the school lands in these provinces should be withdrawn from sale, and leased only, until such time as they can be sold to the best advantage in the interest of the public schools of the provinces. the public schools of the provinces in which they are situated.

He said: I brought this question to the attention of the Senate three or four years ago and the government of the day did not see their way to accept my suggestion. As we have a new government in power, we may have new light, and I am prepared to present facts and figures which will convince this Chamber that we have adopted a wrong principle in disposing of these lands. In the early days the government took two sections out of each township as school lands. Taking the whole area of Saskatchewan, Alberta and Manitoba it will be seen that it aggregates a very large amount of land.

Hon. Mr. CASGRAIN-It is one-eighteenth of the whole thing.

Hon. Mr. POWER.

Hon. Mr. DAVIS-Yes. I have a statement from the department of school lands which I will read, showing exactly what we have. The statement reads as follows:

Assuming the total area of Manitoba to be 41,169,280 acres, and assuming school sections to comprise one-eighteenth or two sections in every township, the approximate area of to comprise one-eighteenth or two sections in every township, the approximate area of school lands in the province of Manitoba is 2,287,82 acres. On the same basis assuming the area of Saskatchewan to be 151,990,000 acres, the approximate area of school lands in that province is 8,438,888 acres, and, assuming the total area of the province of Alberta to be 155,400,000 acres, the area of school lands is approximately 8,633,333 acres. The school lands disposed of by public auction in the province of Manitoba, and in the provisional districts of Assiniboia and Alberta in each year to the 1st of September, 1905, when the provinces of Saskatchewan and Alberta were established, and the average price per acre realized each year are as follows:—
