

PROPOSED BY-LAWS (continued)

~~With the exception of the Secretary-Treasurer~~ <sup>any officer</sup> no officer shall hold office for more than two consecutive years, but <sup>except with the unanimous consent of the Council</sup> at the expiration of one year after vacating office <sup>any officer</sup> may be re-elected.

11. (A) The members resident in any Province may make application in writing to the Dominion Council for the formation of a Provincial Branch. This application shall be in the form specified by the Council and shall, in any case, include the names of three proposed Trustees, and on resolution of the Dominion Council approving the formation of such Branch and appointing such Trustees, the said Branch shall be responsible for carrying out the objects of the corporation within the said province, provided <sup>(1)</sup> that the Bank account of each Branch shall be in the name of one or more such Trustees, <sup>and may be operated as they may direct,</sup> and that no Branch may in any way engage the credit of the Corporation as a whole, <sup>(2)</sup> and that its regulations regarding interment shall only be effective upon a resolution of the Dominion Council approving the same. Each Provincial Branch shall elect the following officers:

President, <sup>Vice-</sup>  
[Vice-President or Presidents]  
Secretary  
Treasurer

(B) A Women's Auxiliary may be formed by any Branch and may make such by-laws and regulations <sup>for the conduct of its work (C)</sup> as it deems necessary. Vacancies among the Trustees of a Branch shall be filled by the Dominion Council on nomination of the Branch.

(D) <sup>(1)</sup> After the formation of any Branch all notices herein provided to be given by the <sup>Dominion</sup> Secretary shall be sufficiently given, if given to the Secretary of such Branch who shall transmit the said notices to the members within one week after their receipt by him, but his failure to transmit any notice shall not invalidate the procedure at a meeting of the Corporation.
