Dear Dr. Keppel:

I have no desire to appear importunate, but the time has passed when we usually send to the printer our Library School announcement, and I find that the Principal has no information yet in answer to his letter of December 21, 1932 in which a request was made for a continuation of the grant from the Carnegie Corporation to the McGill University Library School.

Would it be possible for you to let me know when this matter is likely to be considered in the normal course of events, so that I may not trouble you unnecessarily and, at the same time, plan - or not plan - next year's work?

With regard to the Prince Edward Island Demonstration, I have had no communication at all from the local authorities. I need not assure you that I am ready at all times to aid them to the best of my ability and, should they desire it, can readily arrange a summer library course, provided they do not defer a decision to a date that would interfere with the alternative announcement of our summer course in Montreal.
