Commercial Summary.

MR. JOHN MAY, of Mitchell, Ont., manufac-  
turer of furniture, has opened a branch estab-  
lishment in the village of Hensall.MR. WILLIAM M. MACPHERSON has been ap-  
pointed agent in Quebec of the Sun Life and  
Accident Insurance Company of Canada.The bailiff is in possession of the premises of  
Messrs. Campbell & Lindsay, waggon-makers,  
etc., Glencoe, Ont. Their liabilities amount to  
nearly \$4,000, and assets to about \$1,000.Messrs. J. & J. F. SCOTT, dry goods mer-  
chants of Chatham, Ont., have removed to new  
and more commodious premises, which the in-  
creasing business of these popular tradesmen  
has made a necessity.NOTWITHSTANDING the wet harvest weather,  
the wheat and other grain in the county of  
Kent, Ont., and adjoining counties has been  
pretty well saved, with a larger than average  
yield, particularly wheat. The apple crop will  
be very light in that section this season.THE JOURNAL OF COMMERCE has no connection

priator.MR. J. A. NELLES, bookseller, Guelph, has  
secured an extension from his creditors, and  
about \$2,000, the proceeds of the sale of his  
wife's real estate property, has since been put  
into the business.—W. N. Rogers, a grocer in  
a small way at Gananoque, Ont., is also seek-  
ing an extension of time.MR. WALTER THOMSON, grain dealer of Mitchell,  
Ont., has leased from Mr. Joseph Kidd, of Dub-  
lin, his grist mill and warehouses with a view  
to making Dublin a wheat market. Mr. Thom-  
son is also thinking of re-opening his oatmeal  
mill in the town of Senforth.MESSRS. STOUTENBURG, SMITH & Co., who  
have been in business as general storekeepers,  
in Cookstown, Ont., and latterly Brandon,  
Manitoba, have assigned in trust, with large  
liabilities; it is reported that their safe was  
robbed the night before certain large payments  
were due. An investigation will probably be  
made.
