

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. AN ENEMY OF CANADA

Government Will Issue a Formal Proclamation at

WEST LAND REGULATIONS. The sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan of Ai-berta. Applicant must appear in person et the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, on certain condi-tions. A habitable house is required, ex-cept where residence is performed in the vicinity. OTTAWA, Oct. 18.—The formal proclamation declaring Bulgaria an enemy of Canada and prohibiting Canadians from dealing with the en-emy has been ordered by the govern-ment to be issued and this will be done at once.
