### Free Land

Free Land Grants of 160 acres to bona fide settlers can still be obtained in the northern part of the district by complying with the very easy terms as are fully explained. (Refer to Dominion Government advertisement). Homesteads are obtainable in a part of the country opened up by the C. P. R. extension already referred to.

Fairs Annual fairs are held at Selkirk and Beausejour, where is exhibited for competition samples of grain, vegetables and cattle, dairy products and home industries, and valuable Society and

Special prizes are awarded to the successful competitors. Contributions are also received from the Provincial Government and the Municipalities to provide funds for the purpose.

**Fuel** A splendid supply of wood is within easy reach of the town and all farming sections of the district. The C. P. R. extends to Winnipeg Beach, extending for a number of miles through a wooded country, so that wood can be brought to Selkirk at a low cost from that northern section of the country.

### Supply

Water supply is a most important consideration with prospective settlers. One of the first questions asked is regarding the water supply. In most parts of the district the lands are drained by creeks and their tributaries spread out in all directions, providing a plentiful supply of water all the year, and in
