" Mediterranean, in the month of December " 1755, confisted of one ship of 60 guns, two " of 50 guns, four frigates, and one floop; and "that the garrison of fort Saint Philip, in the " faid month of December, according to the last " returns, made the 31st of July 1755, confisted " of 2860 men (officers included) and that it "doth appear, that no greater number of ships " of war could be sent into the Mediterranean "than were fent on the 6th of April 1706, nor " any greater reinforcement than the regiment "which was fent, and the detachment equal "to a battalion, which was ordered to the relief " of fort Saint Philip, confishently with the " state of the navy, and the various services " essential to the safety of his Majesty's domi-" nions, and the interest of his subjects."

RESOLUTIONS! which I presume were not taken by the whole house: and should it appear that the minority in the debate were members of the greatest property and integrity, who have something of their own to lose, and are tenacious of the right and property of their constituents, and were of opinion that the loss of Minorca was principally owing to the not sending an earlier and stronger naval force into the Mediterranean, than that, which sailed under admiral Byng; to the delay of not sending any reinforcements of troops to that island, till the departure of the said admiral; to the suffering the officers belonging to the garrison to continue absent
