All I ask for my *New Method* is, that it be put to the test, confident that it will speak for itself the moment it is experimented upon. Its adaption, on General Principles, to the Pronunciation is *Something* in advance of all other existing Methods—the Plan being New, Original and Unique any one to be his own judge as in Pronunciation.

In fact, this little work of French in Eight Less popular Language reduced of the Language.
