RESOLUTIONS.

lst.—THAT Intemperance is the fruitful source of crime, disease and poverty, and ought to be deprecated by every individual professing Christianity.

2nd.—That it is painful to observe the extent of Intemperance, from the use of ardent spirits, in this Regiment.

3rd.—That Intemperance has been diminished in other Corps by the formation of Temperance Societies, and that equal success might reasonably be expected to attend the adoption of similar measures in the 24th Regiment.

4th.—That a few of the friends of Temperance do form themselves into a Committee, and endeavour, by every means in their power, both by advice and example, to show, and if possible to convince, their fellow Soldiers of the dangerous and pernicious effects attendant upon the use of ardent spirits.

5th.—That the Committee do consist of *four* persons, whose daty it will be to collect all the information possible, relative to the great object of the Society.

6th.—That the Committee do prepare an Address to their fellow Soldiers, explaining their views, and adopt Regulations for their future guidance.
