MET DEATH THRU BROKEN LUMBER

Joseph Gelinas Electrocuted and Body Burned for 30 Minutes in View of Relatives.

Joseph Gelinas, a tailor, was electrocuted on the corner of Ontario and Duke-streets at 7 o'clock last night by a broken electric high wire.

From the window of his home, 14 Ontario-street, which is right near the corner on the west side, he was attracted by the pyrotechnical sparkling of the live wire, which was foundering and blazing terrifically on account of the dampness of the ground.

In cutting across the corner of the lawn the wire caught the unfortunate man under the chin. He stiffened and dropped forward, his face striking the concrete sidewalk of Quebec-street. The wire was underneath the body and the corpse burned for nearly half an hour, until an automobile from Lombard-street firehall arrived with a line-man of the Toronto Electric Light Co. who cut the wire.
