Policeman Bloodworth's View of Burlesque Shows - Rev. R. B. St. Clair's Trial Continues, and Witnesses for the Defence Give Their Opinions of Plays at Star Theatre.

The trial of Rev. R. B. St. Clair was continued yesterday before Judge Denton. A big representation of clergymen was on hand to help Mr. St. Clair in his defence. These included Rev. Byron Stauffer, Rev. John Coburn, Rev. R. H. Macpherson, Rev. J. Bennett Anderson, Rev. Mr. McGregor, Rev. Dr. Eby and Rev. Joseph H. Locke. At the morning session Constable Thomson testified as to his opinion of the plays at the Star Theatre during the plays at the Star Theatre during his censorship. He declared he had not seen boys at the performance, and that the ages ranged from 20 to 70 years. He admitted that his censorship allowed some leeway in regard to the use of the word "damn."

Rev. Donald Macgregor, associate secretary of social service and evangelism in the Presbyterian Church, stated that he was at the performance in question, and that altho he went
