

The position of Local Union, No. 30, of the Amaigamated Sheet Metal Worker's In-ternational Association, as a result of the decision of the courts that service on their agents was not good service, was rudely shaken by a decision of Chancellor Boyd yesterday. The Chancellor Boyd yesterday. The Chancellor Boyd yesterday. The Chancellor has decided that the Metallic Rooting Company may is-sue a writ against the officers of the local union, and any actions by them or judg-ment pronounced against them will find both the local union and the International Association. The action arose out of an attempt by the Metallic Rooting Company to restrain the metal workers from inter-fering by persuasion or intimidation with their non-union workmen. A surprise of great proportions awaited Mrs. Anderson, who asked the Divisional Court to increase the amount of damages awarded her by Chancellor Boyd, when judgment was delivered yesterday. Chan-cellor Boyd had ordered W. H. Chandler and Annie Chandler to pay Mrs. Anderson was not satisfied, and appealed, with the result that this judgment is reversed. Mrs. Anderson must also pay the costs of the appeal and the original action. In the appeal of Waterous v. Manchester's Progress

The report for the last half year's working of the Manchester (England) Ship Canal shows that substantial improvement was made during that period. Compared with the same period of 1901, the traffic has grown from 1,551,244 tons to 1,827,696 tons During the nine years the ship canal has been open the sea-borne traffic has increased from 686,158 tons to 3,137, 348 tons, the increase last year being 452,000 tons.

In the same period (1894-1902) the gross revenue has increased from f97,-901 to f354,223. The receipts for the second half of 1902 show a net in-grease of f20,456 over the same period of 1901.


