More Perpetual Railway Franchises

York Radial Bill Thrown Out by Committee

Last Hour Legislation Discouraged

Premier Whitney Sets Seal of Disapproval on Measure Electric Railway Promoters Attempt to Work Thru House.

Premier Whitney yesterday made a definite and unequivocal statement that the government is opposed to the granting of perpetual franchises to electric railway corporations.

Mr. Hendrie went to the committee, as the World predicted, armed with the bill because the government was opposed to the granting of perpetual franchises.

HIGHER POSTS TO AMERICANS POLICY OF PERE MARQUETTE

Ottawa, May 18.—(Special.)—The report of Judge Winchester upon the employment of aliens in Canada by the Pere Marquette Railway was taken in the house to-day.
