BIG NEW YORK BRIDGE MAY FOLLOW QUEBEC'S

Serious Defects Alleged to Exist Which Are Similar to Those in Canada's Wrecked Structure.

NEW YORK, Sept. 29.—The Tribune says: Almost five months ago The Tribune called public attention to the fact that there was serious apprehension among competent bridge engineers over what was alleged to be the dangerous overloading of the new Blackwell's Island Bridge across the East River between Manhattan and Queens. The facts presented were convincing enough to induce the board of estimate and apportionment to appoint expert bridge engineers to make an investigation for the purpose of determining whether the new structure as erected was safe for public use. The report of these experts has not yet been made public.

These cover plates, it is asserted by those who depreciate their significance, are really not intended to remedy any serious defect, but merely to cover up the "shop buggies" in the members to which they have been added. Engineers state that what is technically known as "shop buggies" are the result of poor workmanship in the shops where the steel is fabricated. Whatever the cause, the fact remains that buckles have appeared in the carrying members of New York's newest great bridge structure. The appearance of buckles in these members of the Quebec Bridge were the precursors of its disastrous failure.

MAYOR BAIRD AND COUNCIL CARRY POINT

Company Concede Right of City to Enter into Competition—York County News.

East Toronto will on December 15 be legally and in every other way an integral part of the Queen City.

The Ontario Railway Board decided the matter yesterday morning in a fifteen minutes' session, no one appearing to dispute the desire of the townsmen who voted the bylaw.

The portion of York Township between East Toronto and the city will also be taken into the city and the board will hear the application on Oct. 8 at 2 p.m.

Town Clerk, W. H. Clay, assured Chairman Letich that the annexation of East Toronto had been properly voted on and objections were called for, but none were offered.

City Solicitor Chisholm suggested December 15 as a proper date for the union and the order was made by the board. A meeting will be held by the city, about 3000 voters will be added to the city.

Andrew McMillan and Solicitor W. H. Grant appeared for the town, and a number of prominent townsmen were present.

Now that the union is all but consummated, not a little of the credit for the success of the movement may fairly be attributed to Counsellor F. M. Baker of Ward 1, and Ex-Mayor Ross and others who labored long and zealously for the cause when it was not so popular as at present.

At present last night there was general satisfaction at the action of the Railway and Municipal Board here and with regret at the loss of the identity of the town.

The annexation will be incorporated as a town little more than five years ago. Dr. Walters being the first mayor, and the position is morally certain.

The Danforth-avenue street car line and the Bloor-street bridge, must be abandoned, as the city has no funds to carry the cost of the bridge.

That annexation will prove a powerful stimulus to the building of a street car line along the Danforth-avenue together with the pushing forward of the Bloor-street bridge.

outside source. In return for these concessions granted by the council, the Interurban Electric Co. have waived their rights to certain clauses in the original agreement between the municipality and the Stark T. L. and P. system.

The old agreement, under the terms of the Connes Act, forbade the municipality entering into competition with the company in the matter of supplying power, the only alternative being for the municipality to buy out the company.

If in the near future the hydro-electric commission is able to supply cheap power to Toronto, this City of West Toronto will be able to supply power to the city.

Ald. Hain: If we enter into competition with this company, can we get power for municipal use only, or will we be forced to supply manufacturers and private houses?

The city solicitor replied that the municipality was not restricted to supplying power for municipal purposes only.

Ald. Jennings: I don't see the advantage of entering into this matter. With annexation at close hand, why not grant the request of the company to obtain the necessary power and enter into competition with them any time it was desired?

The Interurban Electric Co. will be under the same restriction as the Stark Co. is to-day with regard to transferring their company.
