PRIZE-DRAWING ILLEGAL LABOR COUNCIL WARNED

Benevolent Fund Will Be Created to Distribute the Receipts—Bobby Kerr Reception.

HAMILTON, Aug. 20.—(Special.)—The trades and labor council this evening discussed the letter of Sir Thomas Taylor, who pointed out that the holding of prize drawings in connection with their labor day celebration was a criminal offence. C. I. Atkinson, president of the council, produced written permission from the acting mayor for the drawing, and the members of the council agreed that they had a right to hold the affair because it is a process of charity, in order to make sure that the money goes to the fund which will be put at the disposal of the council. The council also agreed to have a reception for Bobby Kerr, the sprinter, who will be in the city this afternoon. A reception will be tendered to him at the Hotel Hamilton, 14 Crooks-street, died suddenly this morning.

Kicked by a Horse.
