The rain of Monday night did slight damage to the condition of Woodbine track, the water draining well to the ditches. Although the weather yesterday morning was far from ideal, a number of trainers indulged their charges in that work, which is an absolute necessity at every opportunity from now until the opening of the meet.
 Trainer John Noyes enacted the star role with his promising plater, Bugle March, by Nelson-Mrs. Frank Foster. This colt, now four years old, carried the Davies colors in the event last year, but was eclipsed. His subsequent training, however, was so favorable as to result in his sale to the present owner. Bugle March worked five-eighths of a mile yesterday as follows: Quarter in 25, half in 50 1/2, five-eighths in 1:06 2-5. This is not a bad move by a plate candidate this spring.
 Bob Newell's plater, Sammore, also made a creditable showing, and may soon command the respect of the regulars. He ran the same distance, five-eighths of a mile, in 1:07 2-5.
 Trainer Joe Doane worked Betsy Binmore and Ladder of Light each three-quarters. The former was caught in 2:01 1-5, and the latter in 1:22 flat, showing both as well advanced as any at the track.

SMALL TRACKS, TOO

In view of the fact that the Ontario government has decided to reduce the proposed racing fee for mile tracks from \$10,000 to \$7,500, and for half-mile tracks from \$5,000 to \$2,500, The World yesterday made some inquiries in racing circles with a view

to ascertaining what effect this reduction would have on the coming season's racing.
 George Beardmore, who is one of the keenest racing men in Canada at the present time, said it was hard to say what line of action the O.R.C. would adopt in view of the reduction. He thought, however, that the club would for the present season run all the mile tracks under their jurisdiction as a kind of trial, to see how the new government scheme worked out financially.
