SPLENDID PROGRESS WITH SUPERVISED PLAYGROUNDS

Miss Mabel Peters, chairman of the supervised playgrounds committee, remarked yesterday that she believed St. John would have the most systematically supervised playground, at the beginning of any that had ever been started.

This remark was made after the committee, in session at the King's Daughters' hall, had gone over the question of teachers and supplies, and sanctioned arrangements already made.

The great difficulty in getting teachers has been overcome, except that one more is wanted, and it is now believed that this want will be met in a few days.

Miss Burditt, Miss Morton and Miss Miller, who are skilled kindergarten teachers, have consented to take work about as teachers in that capacity, and Miss Stevenson and Miss Scott will alternate as assistants.

Mrs. Chisholm has agreed to give two hours each morning to play the piano for kindergarten games, and a piano has been secured from the W. H. Johnson Company on very satisfactory terms for the season.

Mr. Hill, the janitor of Centennial school, who has entered very enthusiastically into the plans of the ladies, will have the care of the grounds and properties, and will aid in every way to make the playground scheme a success.

Miss Peters and Miss Leavitt yesterday made a large number of purchases of supplies, and today Miss Peters and Miss McLaughlin will be busy on a like errand.

Mrs. H. H. Pickett is ordering the necessary supplies for kindergarten work, for which the tables and chairs of the present kindergarten schools will be available.

The city will provide sand and Hyland Bros. the lumber for the sand lots. The committee yesterday expressed themselves delighted with the progress made, and with the sympathy shown by many citizens.

It is proposed to have a musical afternoon each week, and it is hoped that local musicians will generously come to the aid of the committee in providing this pleasure for the children.

As an illustration of the fact that the young people are alive to what is going on, it may be observed that a number of them have been asking that they be permitted to attend.

It is pleasing to be able to record further evidences and practical ones of interest in and support for the fund for supervised playgrounds, and it is gratifyingly approaching \$100,000, having been increased materially yesterday.
