The students in the Freshman Class are required to prepare an exercise each week, in both Latin and Greek prose composition ; and those in the Sophomore Class have a recitation each week, in both Grecian and Roman History ; the members of Freshman, Sophomore and Junior Classes are required to prepare a weekly exercise, alternately in English composition and elocution.

The members of the Senior Class are required to prepare and deliver two original orations each Term.

The branches of study which are marked with an asterisk (*) in the above course are elective, the student being at liberty to select one of these in each of the Terms in which such are found, and to omit the others. Any one who studies them all, so as to pass satisfactory examination, will be entitled to receive a special Honorary Certificate in addition to the usual Diploma.

☞ The required course of study for the Bachelor's Degree may be completed in three years, by such students as can prepare well for four recitations daily ; but all, who can afford to do so, are earnestly advised to devote the full period of four years to their under-graduate course of study.
