

OFFICERS USED AS SIGN POSTS

Hard Fighting Prevails in Galicia—Roads Hidden by Snow

Copenhagen, Feb. 5.—Winter has laid a firm hand on the south-eastern battle field, where the demoralized Austrian army is being crumpled under the weight of the Russian advance. The temperature is many degrees below zero, the Russians are entrenched in the snow in far superior quarters than the enemy. Helmsen, a Danish war correspondent of the Berlingske Tidende with an interesting account of the terribly hard fighting conditions in this corner of the war theatre, says that the roads are hidden by snow, and the Austrian general staff are using officers as sign posts, stationing them at cross roads, bridges, rivers and in valleys. All ammunition and food supplies are dragged on sledges, and a constant increasing number of recruits are being trained in ski-running. Officers and men are unrecognizable in winter furs and hats. The cavalrymen, which for the most part is now fighting on foot, has discarded their famous red trousers for thicker and more clumsy garments usually worn by the infantry. Feel Way With Ice Staves. When troops are marching through the snow rife and swords are piled on sledges and men feel their way with ice staves. The correspondent adds: "I am telegraphing this from the front in Central Galicia. Field Marshal Asz, who has arrived from Limenova, and his staff are quartered in an old cloister no longer inhabited by nuns. At this part of the front the armies are interlocked. "The Russians tried some days ago to break through the Austrian lines at Latus, and the situation became very serious, but the Field Marshal hurried to the menaced point, where the Austrians already were retreating from their trenches, visited each trench, making flaming speeches to the men and his strong personality had such an effect on the soldiers that they ceased retreating and brought the superior force of Russians to a standstill, at any rate for the present. Snow White Outposts "In the Bukovina district there is an unbroken stretch of wire entanglements in front of the Austrian trenches over a distance of 100 miles. Outposts stationed every 30 yards along this vast line are wrapped in snow-white coats and hats, so it is very difficult for the enemy to distinguish them. "The machine guns are covered with white sheets and mounted on sledges. "The most recent fighting has taken place at night. The Austrians illuminating battlefields by burning innumerable stacks of straw, and the Russians reply with huge electric searchlights."
