PROMPTLY TURN DOWN EXTREMISTS

**United Mine Workers Defeat
Radical Resolutions—Fav-
or Nationalization of U. S.
Mines.**

Indianapolis, Ind., Oct. 4.—The United Mine Workers of America yesterday voted overwhelmingly not to change the union's system of appointing organizers, or the appointive system.

Among resolutions adopted were those favoring immediate nationalization of coal mines and railroads, repeal of the espionage laws and amnesty for all "political prisoners," and self-determination for Ireland.

The convention side-stepped action on

prohibition, but adopted resolutions favoring light wines and beer. No action was taken on these resolutions, the committee advising such a course with a statement that the prohibition question "is purely a social question," on which each citizen has his own views.

Resolutions regarding by delegates as manifesting radical tendencies were rejected outright. The idea of "one big union," the affiliation of the mine workers with the international council of trades and industrial unions to develop working class solidarity and the calling of a convention by U. S. trade unions to form one organization having as its object the abolition of capital and the establishment of a workers' industrial republic in the United States were lost overwhelmingly without discussion.

A resolution favoring immediate nationalization of the mines and that in the operation of the country and that in the operation of the mines, the miners have equal representation in deciding working policies.

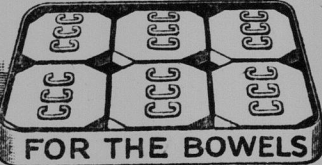

The council considers the housing problem as one of the greatest importance. Speaking on the subject, the Bishop of Algoma reported an alarming prevalence of this defect in his diocese.

The council passed the white crusade proposal, that an effort be made in Lent, 1928, to promote purity in the home and individual life.

RESPECT FOR LAW MUCH NEEDED

Ontario's Attorney General
Dislikes the Prohibition of
Church Fair Games and
Permission of Race Track
Gambling.

Toronto, Oct. 4.—"The great need for the whole of the American continent is respect for law; we have not enough of it in Ontario," said Hon. W. E. Ramey, attorney general of Ontario, at a banquet opening the fall session of the young men's section at the central Y. M. C. A. last night.

Mr. Ramey touched on the subject of business where wheels of fortune and other games were operated for benevolent purposes. "I do not like the law on this subject," he said. "I sympathize with the worthy objects that are held in view by the promoters of these wheels of fortune, but I do not like a law which would prevent charitable inclined ladies to operate a wheel of fortune or hold a raffle, and allow silk-stockinged gentlemen to continue the most colossal form of gambling on the race track. And this huge form of gambling is not for any benevolent purpose but to make millions out of the promoters of the joint stock companies."

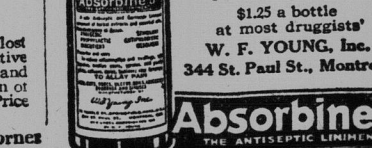

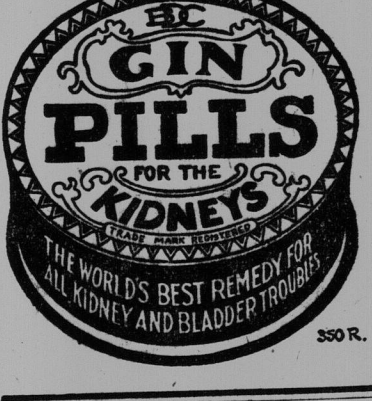
SEEKING TO DETERMINE SEX BEFORE BIRTH

New York, Oct. 4.—Preliminary determination of sex, goal of many scientific experiments with birds and fowls, is being attempted with mammals for the first time at the Carnegie Institute's station on Long Island. A carefully chosen family of mice has been segregated for the experiment.

Biologically, mice are more similar to man than any specimens previously used in seeking predetermination of sex, according to those making the experiments. If successful with mice they plan to apply the results to humans.
