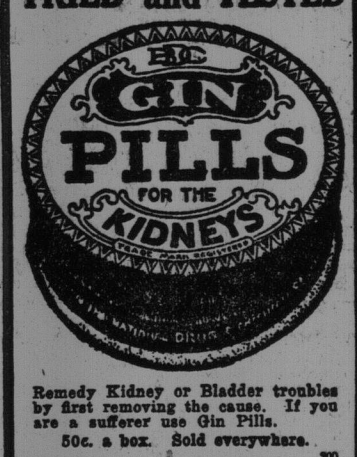

The death of Captain William Sprague occurred in Vancouver recently. He was born in Port Elgin, N. B., and in 1870 had the distinction of commanding the

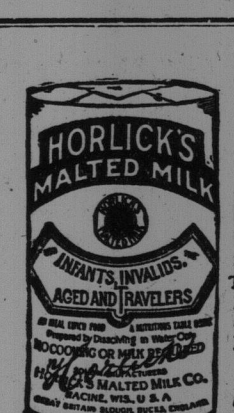
first vessel to bring steel rails across the Atlantic for the construction of the Intercolonial Railway. Captain Sprague has had a distinguished career and many stirring adventures.
