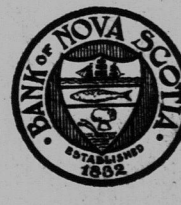

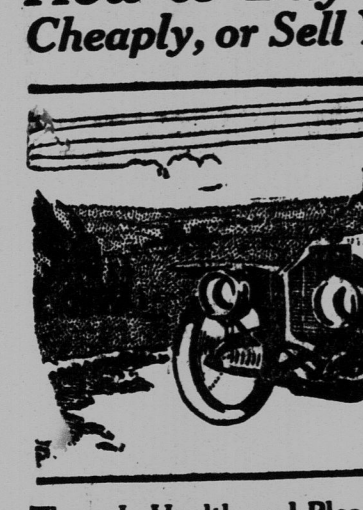

TO TRY PSYCHOLOGY CURE ON CRIMINALS. Harvard Expert to Make Experiment; Football and Church Songs of Same Family.

Boston, Oct. 7.—Working on the theory that crime is a disease and should be cured instead of punished, Dr. Victor V. Anderson of Harvard, assistant to Prof. Hugo Muensterberg, will spend several hours daily in an endeavor to prove that psychology can make over the criminal into an everyday law abiding citizen.

Chief Justice Wilbur Bolster of the municipal court of Boston, believing that there is hope for the criminal in psychology, appointed Dr. Anderson as special probation officer.

Prisoners who keep turning up in court will be watched. The nature of their crimes will be classified to see if they are the result of any mental defect. The shape of their ears, the form of their eyes and their facial expressions will be noticed. They will be compelled to attend little conferences and go through mental examinations and when it seems that there is hope of correcting mental defects they will be sent to the psychopathic hospital.

"The criminal must be examined from a different point of view in the future," said Dr. Anderson. "He cannot be reformed by law. He goes back to his haunts even after the church has corrected him for a time. We must try to get at the character of his thinking and the way in which his attention becomes centralized on certain subjects."

"I believe that psychology will be of the greatest assistance to me in my duties and that many criminals in the future will be cured."
