BUUNDRY LINE Washington, Sept. 4-The full text of the treaty between the United States and Great Britain, fixing and defining the in-ternational boundary line between the United States and the Dominion of Can-ada, in Passamaquoddy Bay, and to the middle of the Grand Manan channel, and removing all causes of dispute on this sub-ject was given out by the state department yesterday. 


