A.51 Yes sir. He told me that there was forty-three dollars in the wallet when he took it from Lieutenant Wood's bed. Three dollars of which he had converted to his own use. The other forty dollars he had deposited at MacLeod and Balcom's drugstore in Kentville for safe-keeping, for which he had received a receipt, which he produced and gave to me. Q.52

Is this the receipt?

A.52 Yes sir.

A.53 We told me further that he disposed of the wallet with its contents in the ash-can at the Staff Officers Quarters. This wallet I might add was never recovered. I took the receipt--Exhibit "G" and proceeded to the town of Kentville to MacLeod and Balcom's Drug Store.

Q.54 Who did you see there?

A.54 Mr. Daniel Campbell.

Q.65 And what did you do on arrival?

A.55 I produced the receipt.

Q.56 Is this the receipt you produced? (Witness is shown Exhibit"G")

A.56 Yes sir.

Q.57 On producing Exhibit "G" to Mr. Campbell what took place?

He produced an envelope out of a cash-box in my presence. A.57

Q.58 I show you that document what is it?

A.58 That is the envelope sir.

Q.59 What was then done with Exhibit "H"?

A.59 It was opened.

Q.60 By whom and when?

A.60 Mr. Campbell opened the envelope in my presence and took from the envelope four ten dollar bills.

2.61 What disposition was made of the four ten dollar bills?

A.61 I took the four ten dollar bills and the envelope now known as exhibit "H" and gave Mr. Campbell a receipt for the same.

2.62 What is that document?

A.62 That is the receipt I gave Mr. Campbell?
