Another Fifty Survivors From Formidable Come Ashore.

EXPOSURE FATAL TO TEN

After Twenty Hours In an Open War-ship's Cutter Fifty Sailors Reach Lyme-Regis on the Dorset Const In a Terribly Exhausted Con-diton—Thirty-Five Officers Lost In the Disaster.

London Advertiser.—We know a man so ultra-British that when he ears from the British battleship Formidable, which was sunk in the English Channel Friday, has reached Lyme-Regis, Dorsetshire, with 50 men, making a total of 201 survivors out of a crew of 780.

When the cutter left the Formidable she had 56 or more men aboard, all but 50 succumbed to exposure, having been in an open boat for some 24 hours in a violent storm.

All the survivors were in a state of exhaustion after their terrible experience. They declare that there is little hope of any further survivors, as the tremendous sea which was running at the time would make it impossible for men to live long enough to be picked up by passing vessels, while many of those clinging to the wreckage were undoubtedly killed when the second explosion occurred. The Admiralty has not issued any statement in reference to the cause of the disaster or where it coeured.
