Flagship For Honolulu

H. M. S. Warspite Will Shortly Sail on a Three Months' Cruise.

Speculators Regarding Her Successor—Sloop Condor Not Expected Till May.

H. M. S. Warspite will vacate the dry dock on Friday next, where she has been on the blocks for five weeks undergoing most extensive repairs.

As the ship lies in dock she is inspected by hundred of strangers to the city, who are in no way dissuaded from gratifying their curiosity to their heart's content.

It is now said in naval circles that the sloop of war Condor, which it was said was following the Amphion, will not be here until May, and she will remain on the Southern station probably until the Warspite reaches there from Honolulu.

The cruiser Leander, which was paid off three weeks ago at Chatham, is to be refitted for another term of foreign service as soon as the ships of the Channel squadron have completed their repairs.
