Marine Notes.

Boston is now getting her full share
of the overseas trade, and the British
director of shipping is sending some
of the larger freighters to that port to
load. The Narrows and Harbord have
been diverted from New York. Nine
big liners were at the different rail-
road terminals on Tuesday loading
with grain, foodstuffs and general
merchandise. Much depends upon the
dispatch given to these steamers. If
it is found that the loading of these
ships can be done uninterruptedly
there is no doubt in the minds of the
steamship men that Boston will con-
tinue to get her full share of business.

Schooner Wrecked.

Gloucester, Mass., Nov. 29.—The
three masted schooner, Br. Con-
sane, was wrecked at Brace's Cove,
Cape Ann, today. Capt. Carey and
his crew of eight men were rescued
in an exhausted condition, by the
Gloucester coast guard cutter. The
schooner probably will be a total loss. She
was bound from St. John, N.B., for
New York, with a cargo of spruce
timber.

Soon after leaving St. John Satur-
day, Capt. Carey said he ran into a
succession of gales and snow storms.
