TOWN PLANNING CITY EXPANSION

Addresses by W. F. Burditt
and H. L. Seymour in Board
of Trade This Evening Under
Auspices of St. John
Branch E. I. C.—Open to
the Public.

New Brunswick was the first prov-
ince in the Dominion to pass a Town
Planning Act. This was in 1912. Now
all but two provinces in the Dominion
have town planning legislation, and it
is understood that legislation has been
proposed for the remaining two, Que-
bec and British Columbia.

St. John will probably be the first
city to put into effect a town planning
scheme, already authorized. Though
this scheme will largely affect subur-
ban areas only, it is all that can be
accomplished under present legisla-
tion.

That New Brunswick has an act at
all and St. John a scheme, can be at-
tributed largely to the untiring ac-
tivities and enthusiasm of W. F.
Burditt, chairman of the St. John
Town Planning Commission. Not
only has Mr. Burditt fathered the
St. John Town Planning Scheme, in-
tended to provide for intelligent future
development in suburbs, but he has in
the past made many excellent sugges-
tions for improvements in the main
part of the city.

This evening Mr. Burditt is going to
speak on Town Planning and City Ex-
pansion, at the Board of Trade Rooms,
under the auspices of the St. John
Branch, E. I. C., the Housing Commit-
tees of the Commercial Club and the
Board of Trade. The meeting is open
to the public, and public-spirited citi-
zens of St. John cannot afford to miss
it.

The Town Planning Board has had
the advantage of the advice of Thomas
Adams, Town Planning Adviser, Com-
mission of Conservation, Ottawa. H.
L. Seymour, his assistant, is now in
the city, in connection with the st.

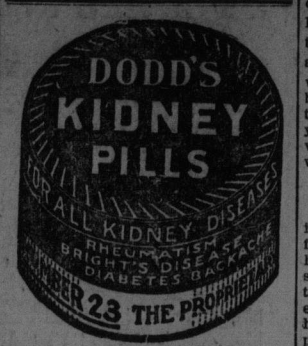


