

## BARBARITIES OF THE TURKS ARE RECOUNTED

Young Priest Gives Account of His Experiences During War-Time Wanderings.

### ARMENIANS HAD CRUEL USAGE

Mother Died With Babies by Wayside—Charity of Man Saved His Life.

Beyroth, Syria, April 27.—Out of the writer of blood and confusion that has swept Syria and Armenia during the past few years the Oriental Seminary of St. Francis Xavier is now being reconstructed to continue the work of preparing a native priesthood to fill the ranks decimated by war and massacre.

As the students, one by one, find their way back to the institution that has been their home since childhood, they bring with them many strange tales of persecution and suffering or of remarkable escapes and deliverances. One of the most remarkable of these tales is that told by Bedros Arakelian, a young Armenian, who miraculously escaped the massacre that decimated the Armenian people.

Ordered Out of Home. Bedros Arakelian was 13 and a student at the Seminary of Amasia, when, in 1914, the war broke out and the fathers were compelled to leave for France. Bedros returned to his native village of Nev Chehr.

One day in July, 1915, a public order passed through the village proclaiming that all Armenians must leave the city. The following morning government employees, followed by gendarmes with firearms, entered the houses and seized and imprisoned all the males between 15 and 60.

The women and children, with some young boys, among them Bedros, were told to depart. Immediately Bedros and his sister, who had with her two children, vacated the house. Five young Turks entered and divided the furniture. Vart, the eldest, had twenty Turkish pounds. Provisions, blankets and a few clothes were packed and the sorry caravan took the road from Nev Chehr to Bozanti, whither they were ordered. To add to the general terror there were only two gendarmes to guard the party. The next day the party arrived at Ouriou Kichla, where it remained five days.

Mother Died With Babies. From Bozanti the pilgrims were pushed on to Tarsous, a journey of several days, during which many women, in endeavor to keep up with them, stayed by the roadside and died with them.

From Tarsous to Adana, and from Adana to Gassian, and from Gassian to Adana, and thence to Adana, the little family was pushed cruelly forward by the officials. Their store of money was exhausted, and they were nothing ahead of them but suffering, more hardships of the road and cold and hunger.

Bedros was fortunate at Adana, for he made the acquaintance of a charitable man, Dr. Toni Sakak, who gave him 20 piastres and bade him return each day for food. He also secured the assistance of some Armenian priests and so saved his life.

BEAUTY OF THE SCHOOL. New York, April 27.—Miss Allison McBain, of Sherbrooke, Que., was selected by Coles Phillips, an artist, as the most beautiful girl in New York. University circles lay right at a concert of the combined musical clubs of the university in the town hall.

She is the daughter of James McBain, of Sherbrooke, and when in this city makes her home at 13 West Fifty-first street.

Miss McBain is a blonde, and was selected, because of her "grace, personality, magnetism and line."

The opening day of the national convention of women voters to be held in Washington in February will be in the nature of a suffrage jubilee during which the memory of the great suffragists will be honored by the unveiling in the rotunda of the National Capitol of a memorial statue in heroic size.

The statue is the work of Miss Adelaide Johnson, an American sculptress. Jane Addams of Chicago has been selected to present the statue in behalf of the women of America.
