No public moneys will be received by Districts which fail to establish Schools under the Act. It will be observed that the amount of Provincial and County moneys to be expended in any District in aid of Schools will depend almost exclusively upon local exertion, or the direct efforts made by the people of the several Districts in maintaining their own Schools.
