On behalf of the Radisson Historical Society I wish to express our appreciation for the cooperation and contributions we received from the RCMP Public Relations Branch and their historical staff.

In the fall of 1980 we decided to publish a local history book. We wanted to include a chapter on the local law enforcement agencies who had faithfully served our area since 1902. These agencies were the RNWMP, the Saskatchewan Provincial Police, and, since 1928, the RCMP.

We, the members of the Radisson and District Historical Society, Inc., would like to publicly acknowledge this contribution made on our behalf, and sincerely thank all those persons involved. Our book, "Reflections of Radisson 1902-1982," was released in February 1983, and because of the efforts of your members a chapter on our policemen is included.
