example, saw the liquor traffic still hold-ing its place; 1916 sees the private sale of liquor in that province entirely abolished and only twenty-three Govern-ment-owned shops left. January, 1916, in Alberta saw the liquor trade still powerful; January, 1916, sees it overwhelmed. It has been voted out of existence by the people, and the doors of every bar and shop will close on July 1st of this year, and after that date there also be no club licen es. licen ses

January, 1915, in Manitoba, saw the Roblin Government still entrenched 1916 sees the Norris Government in power and pledged to the most far-reaching social reforms, including the early submission of a referendum or total prohibition

During the past year in British Columbia the Liberal party under Mr. Common the Internal Party united Strike Breaster has taken on a new lease of life, and has also adopted a definite stand in favor of a referendum for total prohibition. It will be interesting to watch what the Bowser Government will do.
