MACKINTOSH, CHARLES HERBERT. (City of Ottawa.)

S. of Capt. William Mackintosh, of Wicklow, Ire., who came to Canada as an attaché of the Ordnance branch of the British Army, and afterwards Co, Engineer of Middlesex, Ont.: related to Sir James Mackintosh. the essavist and historian. B. in London, Ont., 1843. Ed. at Galt Grammar School, and Caradoc Academy. M., 7 April, 1868, Gertrude, dau. of T. Cook, Esq., J.P., of Strathrov. Wrote "Welcome to H.R.H. Prince of Wales," (1860) which was presented at the time of his visit to Canada. Wrote (1862) "Hurry-graphs" under the nom-de-plume of Fat Contributor for the London Free Press, and became City Editor of that Journal. giving up the study of law. Became City Editor Hamilton Times, 1864, and in 1865 published Strathroy Dispatch until 1874. Wrote (1871) and published "The Chicago Fire;" wrote (1873) "The Financial Panic in U.S. and its Causes." Was Managing Editor of Chicago Journal of Commerce, 1873, having taken that position to study the Protection question. In 1874 became Editor in chief of Ottawa Daily Citizen. Edited the Canadian Parliamentary Companion from 1877 to Published various pamphlets containing Protec-1882. tion speeches from 1876 to 1878. Was awarded gold and silver medal (1875) for prize poem at O'Connell Centennial. Founded Farkhill Gazette in 1871. Member of Strathrov Town Council 1873. Mayor of Ottawa 1879. 1880 and 1881. Chairman of Dominion Exhibition, 1879. and Presdt, Agri. Association, 1881. First returned to Parlt., at g.e. 1882. An unsuccessful candidate for Russell. at g.e., 1887, but returned for the City of Ottawa upon vacancy occurring 1890. Re-elected at last g.e. MCALISTER, JOHN. (Restigouche.)

Father came from Scotland and settled in Restigouche in 1836. Born in the Parish of Durham, Restigouche, 27 July, 1842, and ed. at the Common Schools there, and at the Presbyterian Academy, Miramichi. Unmarried. Admitted to the Bar, N.B., 1879. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Conservative.—Campbellton, N.B.
