The International Boundary spray zone. Commission has suspended the spraying of herbicide along a form a human chain around the spraying machines; they called off their demonstration when it was announced the spraying would be stopped.

The Commission had planned to spray from Boundary Bay, south of Vancouver, thirty-two miles inland to Langley, B.C. The herbicide was to be used in a brush and tree clearing operation to clear a ten-foot strip of land on either side of the border.

The spraying had been opposed by the Canadian Scientific Pollution and Environmental Control Society (SPEC), a western Canada environmental organization, at the request of residents of Langley. SPEC claimed that the herbicide. Liquid Brush Killer LV-96, contained the herbicides 2, 4-D and 2, 4, 5-T, which it said "has been associated with birth defects in both humans and laboratory mice."

Residents of Langley feared contamination of their seepagewell drinking water and of their livestock, much of which drinks either from Samhill Creek or the Campbell River, both of
