Sound off continued Godiva symbolic of what?

Dear Editor, this is a copy of a letter sent to the Dean of Students Dr. G. Barry Thompson, in objection to the Godiva ride:
Dr. G. Barry Thompson

Dear Dr. Thompson,

After our conversation about the Lady Godiva ride, I discussed the issue with a number of people on this campus and have become convinced that there is more widespread disapproval than we perhaps expected. I have therefore decided on two courses of action. First, I would like to lodge a complaint with you with regard to the practice on the grounds that it is a degrading and discriminatory event. Second, a number of students will be circulating a petition in order to underscore the extent of the disapproval on campus. And finally, I understand that the Brunswickan will be giving publicity to the petition and following the developments on the issue.

As you requested, I will now attempt to briefly delineate the

issues which I perceive to be involved.

It is perhaps most appropriate to start by identifying what the issue is not. First, this is not a puritanical crusade, the issue is not an objection to nudity. Second, it is not an attack on the Engineering faculty at UNB specifically as it is realized that this has been a commonly held practice on many other campuses. Third, it is not an objection to harmless collegiate antics. However, whatever the intent, the outcome of this event is the exploitation of a minority group on this campus.

A custom which allows a group of predominantly male members to organize an event in which a single female is the target of public disrespect, reflects on the integrity of both the males and females in that community. The depersonalization of the human involved, particularly when that person is not clothed, is a degrading experience for all.

Lady Godiva is a symbol, but a symbol of what? Does she tell us that women are important contri-

butors to Engineering science? I think not. More likely, her ride implies that women are playmates and not colleagues, that women are no more than physical property.

In 1980 When we pay lip service to all professions being open to all worthy candidates, Engineering faculties are allowing informal discriminatory practices which surely make it uncomfortable for many members of the university community both inside and outside the faculty.

Finally, I would like to mention that students have suggested that if no resolve is achieved, the matter should be taken to the larger community. It is my hope that the university will respond in a relevant and constructive fashion which will make this quite unnecessary.
