Dear Dr. Hoy:

I have received your several letters in regard to the Peace Propagenda, and have had a talk with Mr. Marcil about the French clergy.

From what Mr.Mercil tells no, there would be little
use in your sending circulars to the Roman Catholic clergy, which
you first of all obtained the consent of the Bishops, as any use
which might be made of the circular would have to be, first of all,
with the authority of the Bishops. What Mr.Marcil suggested, and
what I think would be decidedly the best line of procedure, would
be for one or two members of your Society to get personally in
touch with the Archbishop in Toronto, or one or two of the leading
clorgy there, and arrange through them to get the sympathetic support
and co-operation of the Roman Catholic Church throughout the
Dominion. This would have to be done with some care, and by personal
interviews rather than written communications. You will find, I
think, that the Roman Catholic church, particularly in Quebec, will
be heartily in accord with the work of the Society. Just now all
of the leading members are attending the Plenary Council in
