## Old Sun's Roarding School

The great for the above named quarter, calculated on an average attendance of 29.68 pupils, amounted to \$742.00. From this amount was deducted the sum of \$265.75 for 2,477 lbs. of beef supplied during the months of May.

June, July, August and September, leaving a balance of grant due of \$476.25, a cheque for which was sent you.

## Blood Boarding School,

The average attendance, as shown by the returns received from this school for the September quarter, was 34.99 pupils, the grant for which amounted to \$847.75, was 34.99 pupils, the grant for which amount for 1,993 a deduction of \$169.40 was made from this amount for 1,993 that, of beef supplied during the months of June, July, Auglist and September, last, leaving a balance of grant due the school of \$705.35.
