
Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of a requisition for supplies for the Cape Croker School, and in reply I beg to say that the erasers and slate pencils will be ordered from the Government Stationery Office.

You may purchase for this school one gallon of floor oil, twenty-five yards of gingham for the sewing class, four boards, butternut or similar wood, eight or twelve feet long, for the manual training class and one pound each of half inch, one inch, inch and a half and two inch nails. You will be good enough to forward detailed accounts, in duplicate, properly certified, for the expenditure incurred in the purchase of these supplies.

The Department is making inquiries in regard to the desks asked for by the teacher, and you will be further advised in regard to these.
