I then was handed an envelope full of broken glass, said to have been picked up and the scene of the theft. These were checked up carefully for finger prints but without avail. However, unmistakable traces of gloves were to be seen on one or

two of the pieces.

I examined the canteen, paid particular attention
to the broken window. I am of the opinion that this window
was broken from the inside out. Further more, I was shown
a boot print on a blanket which was on a bed directly under

In of the formation, it appears to me extremely improbable the job was done from the outside. I wish to draw the attention to the imprint of the left foot as it would be almost impossible for man to go through the windows from the outside in such a fashion as to set his left foot printing towards the center of the room.

I reported the results of said investigation to Major Bernatchez by whom I had been detailed.
