

he says "I owe him about \$300.00 at the store"; is that a correct statement?

A I think that is right.

THE CHAIRMAN: In making your inquiry about this matter, did you ever see these people who ^KCapoose said were present when the agreement was made?

A No, because Brynildsen said there was no written agreement made.

MR COMMISSIONER CARMICHAEL: Don't you think you could get that matter adjusted so ^KCapoose could get that land - did you ever talk to Brynildsen about it?

A Brynildsen is what you would call a pig-headed man and he stands pat.

MR COMMISSIONER SHAW: Did Hammer ever live on the land?

A I don't think he ever saw the land.

Q Do you believe that ^KCapoose ever had enough money to pay Brynildsen for this land?

A I think he has. There are two men - Jacobsen and Kellog of Bella Coola - they have cattle at south Bentick Arm; they have land, I understand, on both sides of the reserve, but they cannot find the lines ~~lands~~ and they want to fence it and they ask that this reserve be surveyed so that they can find the lines.

Q What reserve is it?

A Talleo Reserve of the Bella Coola Agency. I thought of writing the Department and asking that this reserve be surveyed, but I am afraid they will tell me to wait until the work of the Commission is over.

Q Have you ever been there?

A Yes.

Q Can they find the posts at all?

(Witness here reads letter, dated Sept. 3rd, 1915, signed by Jacobsen and Kellog)

MR COMMISSIONER MCKENNA: I think it is up to these two men to make the survey.

MR COMMISSIONER CARMICHAEL: I think it is a Departmental matter in any event and the Commission has nothing to do with it.
