MARKET REVIEW AND FORECAST

Toronto, Monday, July 13.—The fruit crop gets first attention on city markets at the present time. Cherries are arriving in immense quantities, and are selling for just one-half of what they commanded last year. Not only is the crop larger, but new orchards are coming into bearing. Peaches will be a very heavy crop. Strawberries are about done over, and the season is over. Apples are very short, though the crop is not an absolute failure as was at first reported.

General trade continues unchanged, or slightly more business done than in past months, but nothing very active yet. Another slump in this city is being felt there are more men out of work now than for many years past, and this is the season of the year. What will next winter be? The ordinary layman is not inclined to be so optimistic regarding the outlook as is the Finance Minister. Those conditions are affecting the farmers' markets. Particulars in this city are unchanged in meat; many consumers seem to have gone on strike.

WHEAT. Latest Government reports from the United States predict a crop fully up to earlier expectations. These reports have not had the depressing effect on the market that might have been expected. Exports from the Canadian west are not so favorable. There is a fear that rust may yet do considerable damage to wheat in the south-west. Hence the net result of the week's trading has been a slight advance in the south-west and a decline in the north-west.

No. 1 Northern is now quoted at 90c; No. 2, 85c. Ontario wheat is druggier at 85c. The dull demand for Ontario flour is largely responsible for lack of interest in wheat.

COARSE GRAINS. The most active inquiry in coarse grains has been for barley, but so far quantities available have been small. Crop prospects are more interesting at the present time than market quotations. Oats, W. No. 2, 40c; Ontario, 38c; Ontario, 40c to 41c; corn, 76c; peas, 98c to 1.01; barley, malting, 56c to 60c; rye, 65c to 66c; buckwheat, 90c to 96c.

HAY AND STRAW. Practically no new hay has arrived on the market as yet. Quotations on old hay are: timothy, 1.20 to 1.30; clover, 1.10 to 1.20; alfalfa, 1.00 to 1.10; straw, 80c to 90c.

MILL FEEDS. Mills are not now heavily stocked, and demand and supply are about equal. Flour, 85c; shorts, 82c; middlings, 80c to 82c; feed flour, 80c to 82c.

EGGS AND POULTRY. Receipts of eggs are somewhat restricted, and there are no prospects of lower prices. Hot weather recently has resulted in poor quality of many shipments. Wholesale price for selling is 15c; retail, 16c.

Strawly new laids, in cartons, 35c to 50c; extra fine, 50c to 60c; ordinary, 20c to 30c; mixed, 15c to 25c; Montreal are: extra 25c to 35c for fairs; selected, 25c to 27c, and down to 20c. Eggs at Montreal are set at 15c to 16c.

Receipts of dressed poultry are increasing and quotations are: dressed, heavy, 15c to 16c; light, 13c to 14c; live, fat, 10c to 12c; chickens, dressed, 12c to 13c; turkeys, dressed, 18c to 20c; live, 15c to 16c.
