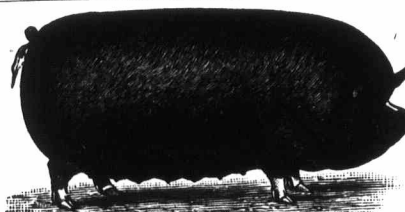

GOSSIP.

From his Dorset flock of 35 head, 30 of which are breeding ewes, Mr. R. H. Harding, Thornedale, Ont., offers in this issue 20 of this year's produce, including lambs of either sex. Mr. Harding's flock was established on foundation stock from the best English flocks, on which McCalmont and Flower rams have been used. The lambs that are offered are a grand lot, sired by imported Lord Roberts.

D. G. J. Fitzgerald, V. S., London, Ont., has recently imported from the U. S. the grand 5-year-old Thoroughbred stallion, Rappahannock, by Potomac, he by the Derby winner, St. Blaize; dam Lavina Belle, by Longfellow; her dam was Belle Knight, the dam of Queenland. Potomac was the winner of the Futurity and other stakes aggregating \$125,000 during his career. Rappahannock is a handsome chestnut, 16 hands high, on stout legs, heavy bone, and is well calculated to produce hunters and saddlers of the highest type.

The two days' combination sale of Berkshire swine, announced to be held at Springfield, Ill., Aug. 8th and 9th, proved a miserable failure, though extensively advertised, being attended by few others than the contributors. On the first day of the sale fine large sows of the best breeding sold at prices little if any above pork prices. It was anything but encouraging to the breeders who prepared and shipped stock to the sale at considerable expense.

GEO. B. PHIN'S SHROPSHIRE AT HESPELER.

Mr. J. P. Phin, whose farm (The Grange) lies within view of the village of Hespeler, Ont., has been closely associated with Shropshire sheep breeding since their presence in this country. The farm is peculiarly adapted to sheep-raising. Within the last year the farm and flocks have been taken over by his son, Mr. Geo. B., whose life-long experience with his father along this line has fitted him for a favorable continuance of the business. The foundation of the present flock was established and founded upon importations selected from such flocks of note in England as those of Tanner, Minton, Bowen-Jones, Thomas, Farmer, and Barber, upon which none but high-class rams have been employed. The present ram was imported by Robert Miller, and is a sheep of good size and quality, full of Shropshire character, having good bone, fleece and skin. His lambs inherit his superior covering and length. Another very choice imported shearing ram was on hand from Mr. Thomas' flock, Earl Shrewsbury, Shropshire, England. He too is a sheep worthy of the attention of parties requiring the services of a high-class ram. Mr. Phin is offering a limited number of choice young things for sale, as his ad. indicates.

MR. E. DOOL'S YORKSHIRES TO BE AT THE INDUSTRIAL.

When in Frontenac recently the writer called upon Mr. E. Dool, at Hartington, and looked over the extensive herd of Yorkshire swine which has sounded their owner's praise far beyond the borders of the country and province in which he resides. Mr. Dool has labored patiently and persistently with his favorite breed, and maintains a large list of typical brood sows of the best and most fashionable blood. Many family lines are represented, as we found in reviewing their pedigrees, and perhaps no breeder has given more subject of judicious matings. The last two years the imported boar, Oak Lodge Hotspur 3042, by Metchley Hotspur, and out of Metchley Novice 2nd, has stood at the head. It will be remembered that he was selected by Mr. Brethour from the noted English breeder, Denston Gibson. He is a hog of great character and Yorkshire type, and strong in bacon conformation, which he transmits with much certainty. We have seen a few of his sons approaching maturity, and without exception their individual turpitude, and without exception their individual merit would recommend them. When we called, Mr. Dool was well stocked with young things of either sex, a good supply of which he intends taking with him to the Toronto Industrial, where his old and new customers will find them in the best of breeding form.

RICHARD HONEY'S HOLSTEINS, YORKSHIRES AND COTSWOLDS.

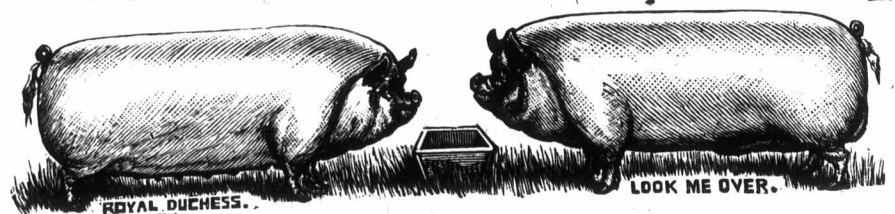

She has also proven herself capable of winning many of the highest honors for which she has competed, and her kind is worthy of attention of parties requiring the services of young sires and foundation females.

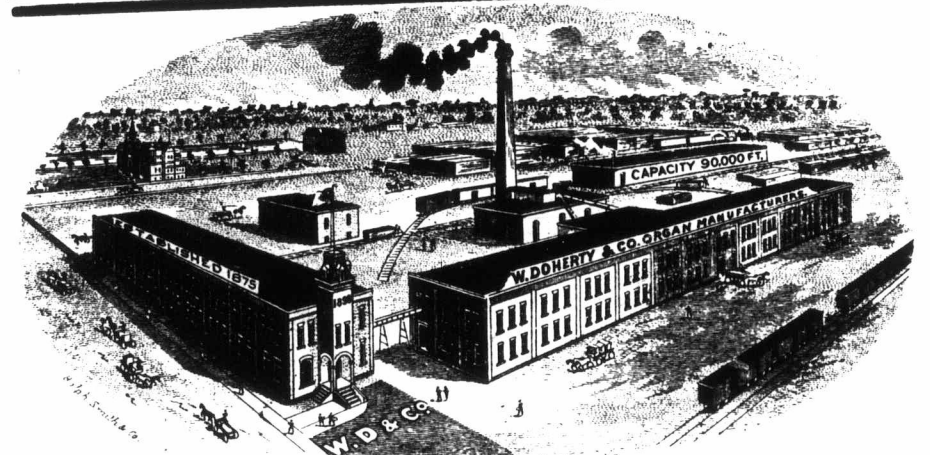

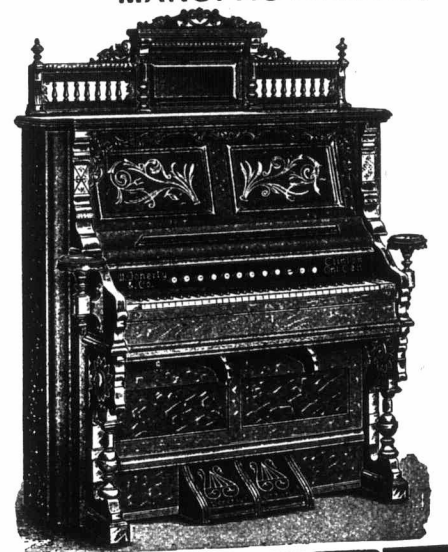

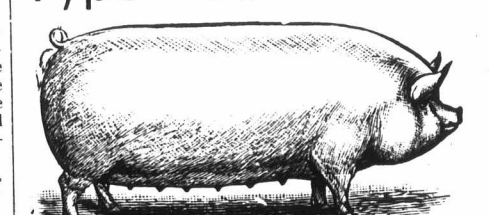
