The Bill was accordingly read a second time; and committed to a Committee of the

Ordered, That the Resolutions agreed to this day, in relation to an Act to amend the Post Office Act, be referred to the Committee of the whole House on the foregoing Bill.

The Order of the Day for the second reading of the Bill to authorize the incorporation of the Cobourg, Peterborough and Marmora Railway and Mining Company, being read;

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee to consider a certain proposed Resolution relative to the appointment of a Registrar for the Judicial District of Nipissing.

Resolved, That the Governor in Council may appoint a Registrar of Deeds to the Judicial District of Nipissing, who shall register all Deeds and other Conveyances and Agreements relating to lands situate in any part of the said Judicial District, and laid out and surveyed by the Crown; that his fees shall be the same as those appointed by the Laws of Upper Canada respecting the registration of Instruments; or the Governor in Council may order an annual Salary, not exceeding eight hundred dollars, to be paid to the Registrar, out of the Consolidated Fund, in lieu of such fees; which fees, in such case, shall be paid into such revenue.

Resolution to be reported.

Ordered, That the Report be received on Tuesday next.
