Woodstock, Oct. 1 .- According to the assessor's roll, which was returned to the city clerk to-day, Woodstock has dropped 181 in population since last year. The total population is given as 10,084, as against 10,265 last year. There has been a substantial decrease in real assessable property, however, the decrease amounting to \$108,976. The total real property, including exemptions, is \$5,-776,383. The exemptions amount to \$1,208,250, and consist of factories churches, schools and municipal and Government property. The total income assessment is \$122,299, an increase of about \$9,000. \*\*\*\*
